
Meetings are held monthly on every third Tuesday at 7 pm at county party headquarters, 519 Hickory St., West Bend. Any party member is welcome to attend.

# RNC NATIONAL CONVENTION

The RNC national convention for the 2020 presidential campaign will be held in Charlotte, NC from August 24-27, 2020. The WCRP is allowed to send up to three national convention nominees to the 5th CD caucus, where they must campaign to against other county nominees to represent the 5th district at the national convention. Three delegates and three alternate delegates for the 5th congressional district will be chosen at the 2020 5th CD Caucus. The WCRP has a policy for who is eligible to run for national delegate. An eligible candidate MUST: be a current WCRP delegate for at least one year and a WCRP member in good standing for at least two years. They must be willing to attend and be prepared to give a campaign speech at the WCRP caucus on Feb. 9, 2020 at the Columbian Banquet Hall. If they are chosen at the WCRP caucus, they must be willing to attend and give a campaign speech at the 202 5th CD caucus. If they are chosen there, they must sign an affidavit and commit to attending the RNC national convention, which includes financial responsibility for convention registration fees, airline transportation fees, hotel expenses, meals and all other miscellaneous expenses. All national delegates must stay at the hotel designated by the Republican Party of Wisconsin. Expenses can be expected to be in the range \$3000.00 - \$4000.00 per person. Finally, all WCRP national delegates must support the 5th CD's nominated presidential candidate. ### **Assembly Report**

In the state budget, Republicans made significant investments in all areas of our criminal justice system, improving the process from start to finish. We know that in order to be effective policy makers on this issue, we need to look at what can be improved upon from once someone enters our system to when they transition back into society. Our ultimate goal is to keep our communities safe: locking up offenders and rehabilitating individuals to become successful, contributing members of society. Nationally, over 95% of individuals who enter the prison system will return back into our communities. That's why Republicans supported initiatives that help them transition back into society. In order to eliminate delayed court dates, Republicans provided funding to increase the private bar rate to \$70 an hour. The lack of private attorneys willing to represent indigent defendants has led to individuals sitting in jail for weeks and even months waiting for their day in court. It is so important that we protect the Sixth Amendment and ensure that the accused have access to counsel. We also approved a request from District Attorneys across the state to fund an additional 64.85 Assistant District Attorney positions. These additional positions will make sure our prosecutors are able to effectively and efficiently enforce the law. Lastly, we allocated additional resources to the counties to make sure they can appoint attorneys for those who need them. Last summer, the Wisconsin Supreme Court raised the rate for court appointments made by counties to \$100 hour. The additional funding provided by the Legislature will help counties with these court-appointed cases, with 75% of them being guardian ad litems that provide representation for children.

### State Senate Report

#### Did vou know?

- Our last budget started with a surplus of more than \$1 billion.
- We've cut taxes by more than \$8 billion since 2011.
- Wisconsin is finally out of the top ten highest taxed states in the nation.
- Wisconsin's GDP was 2.9% for the first quarter of 2019 That's higher than Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, and Michigan.
- For all of 2018, Wisconsin's economy grew 2.5%, the best year of growth for the state since 2010.
- The property tax bill on a median valued home is lower now than it was back in 2010.
- For the last 17 straight months, Wisconsin's unemployment rate stayed at 3% or lower. Unemployment has never been this low for this long since records were kept.
- Our labor force participation rate is five points higher than the national average.
- WalletHub ranks Wisconsin as the 6th best state to live in.
- Wisconsin ranks number one in the Midwest for Health Care Access and Patient Safety.
- CNBC ranks Wisconsin as the 17th best state in the nation for business.
- According to the Center for Research on the Wisconsin Economy, the income for a median family of four in Wisconsin grew 13.1% since 2010. Nationally, incomes grew 10.7%.
